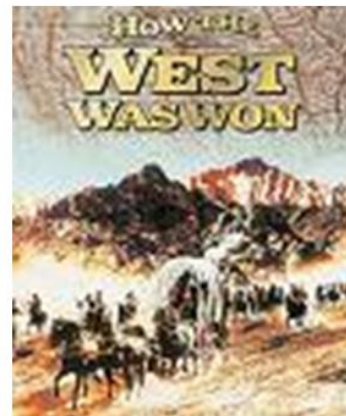

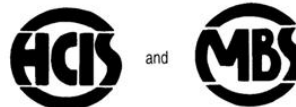

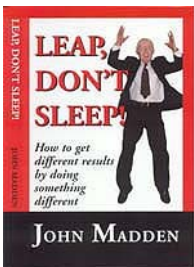

Unplugged – Reclaiming our Right to Die in America

As Terry Schiavo’s heart-wrenching final months drew to a close, it became clear that the questions surrounding the nature of life and death in a time of amazing medical advances - and sometimes futile medical interventions - have never been so complex or so contentions. About the Campaign

As America's population ages and the first of the "baby boomers" turn 60 years old, nursing homes and stakeholders are coming together to improve the quality of care and quality of life for those living or recuperating in America's nursing homes.

Quality means care and services that respect the individual's needs and choices, improve the likelihood of achievable clinical outcomes, and are consistent with evidence-based knowledge.

Advancing Excellence in America's Nursing Homes is a two year, coalition-based campaign concerned with how we care for elderly and disabled citizens.

1. Reducing high risk pressure ulcers;
2. Reducing the use of daily physical restraints;
3. Improving pain management for longer term nursing home residents;
4. Improving pain management for short stay, post-acute nursing home residents;
5. Establishing individual targets for improving quality;
6. Assessing resident and family satisfaction with the quality of care;
7. Increasing staff retention; and
8. Improving consistent assignment of nursing home staff, so that residents regularly receive care from the same caregivers.
